Are you a registered Moricetown Band Member interested in post-secondary education? Are you registered for post-secondary studies? Are you trying to find ways to help support your studies?

Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada (AANDC) has two funding programs that could provide financial assistance for eligible Status Indian students to help offset tuition, travel or living expenses.

- If you are a registered Moricetown Band member student who is registered with an eligible post-secondary institution for either full-time or part time studies you may qualify for financial support.
- If you are an eligible Status Indian student registered for university or college entrance programs to help you achieve the academic requirements necessary for entrance into a post-secondary degree or diploma program, you may qualify for financial assistance.

Moricetown Band Members can contact your local post-secondary counsellor to explore your eligibility and options.

Other band may contact their respective Band to apply for funding to attend our programs.

U.C.E.P: University College Entrance Program 2018/2019

The UCEP program will provide students with the necessary courses to meet the entrance requirements in order to apply to the Public Post-Secondary Institute of their choice. Students will not only complete the Grade 12 Adult requirements, they will also complete 2 college courses that may be transferrable credits towards a Post-Secondary Program. The Program is offered at the Moricetown Adult Education Centre.

Human Service Worker Diploma 2018/2019

The Indigenous Human Service Diploma prepares learners with a career in non-profit agencies, Indigenous communities and government. Graduates will be able to provide support and assistance to individual, families and communities coping with economic disadvantage, mental health issues, developmental, gender and diversity issues, as well as challenges such as addictions, family change and involvement with the justice system. Learners who wish to continue their education have the opportunity to ladder into the Social Work Degree Program at NVIT. The Diploma will be available in Witset (Moricetown)

Admission Requirements

The Indigenous Human Service Program admits 25 students who begin study in September. Applicants will need to meet the general, education and personal readiness requirements

Business Administration Certificate 2018/2019

Business Administration provides programs designed to assist individuals and communities to meet the leadership and management challenges of business and Aboriginal self-sufficiency and self-government. Students will be:

- equipped with a combination of general organizational knowledge, and specific technical, analytical and management skills;
- encouraged to develop a management style consistent with traditional and/or current Aboriginal values, beliefs, cultures and customs;
- enriched with the practical knowledge that comes from working in Aboriginal organizations; and
- qualified to transfer certain courses into advanced studies of management and business in a variety of university degree programs.

Admission Requirements

Grade 12 graduation or equivalent with:

- C+ minimum in Math 11 Foundations or equivalent assessment; and MATH 057 or Foundations of Math 11 or equivalent assessment
- C+ minimum in English 12 or ENGL 060, or equivalent assessment.
